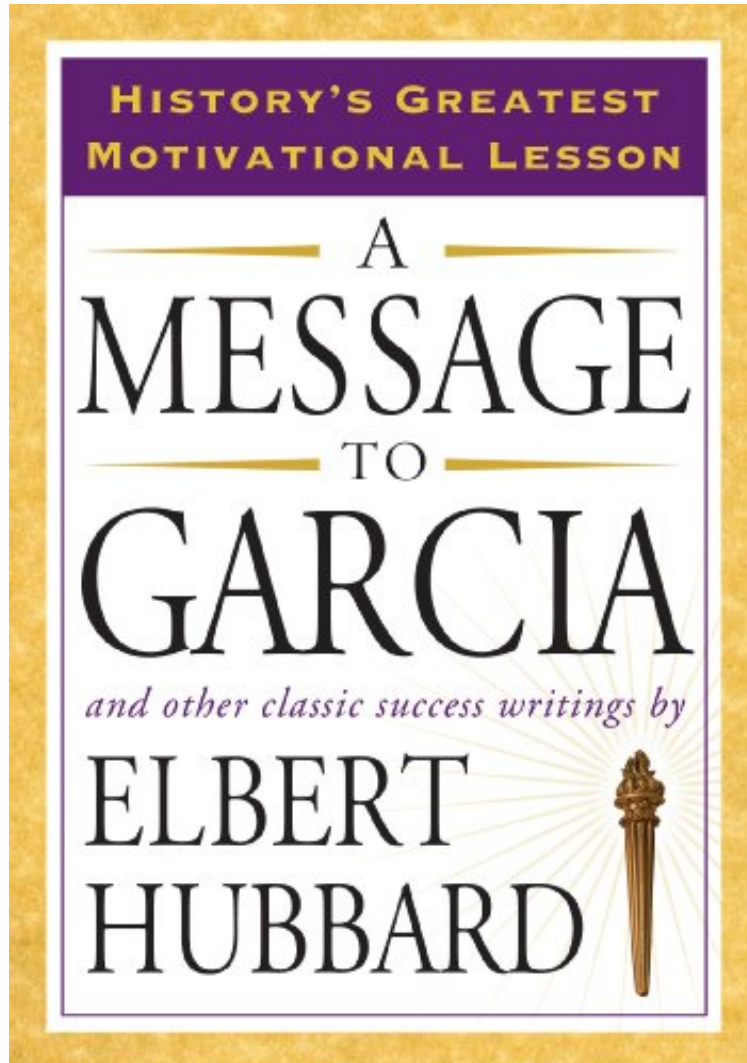

I am planning on reading all those books and the books on the Secretary of the Army's reading list as well. It's not well written, and not easy to follow so it loses a lot of points in that area. I think it would have been better if the story itself were told and not broken up by commentary throughout the book. It reads like a discombobulated and watered down epic poem. Tell the story, then comment on it. If you must break it up, do it in a chapter style format. Tell a chapter of the story then give commentary. The message the book conveys is wonderful. A soldier does what they do when they are told to do it. They don't ask questions, they just do. It's also a good book on management. It says, as a leader, you should give a task to be done, and let the "subordinate" figure out how to get it done and let them do it on their own.
