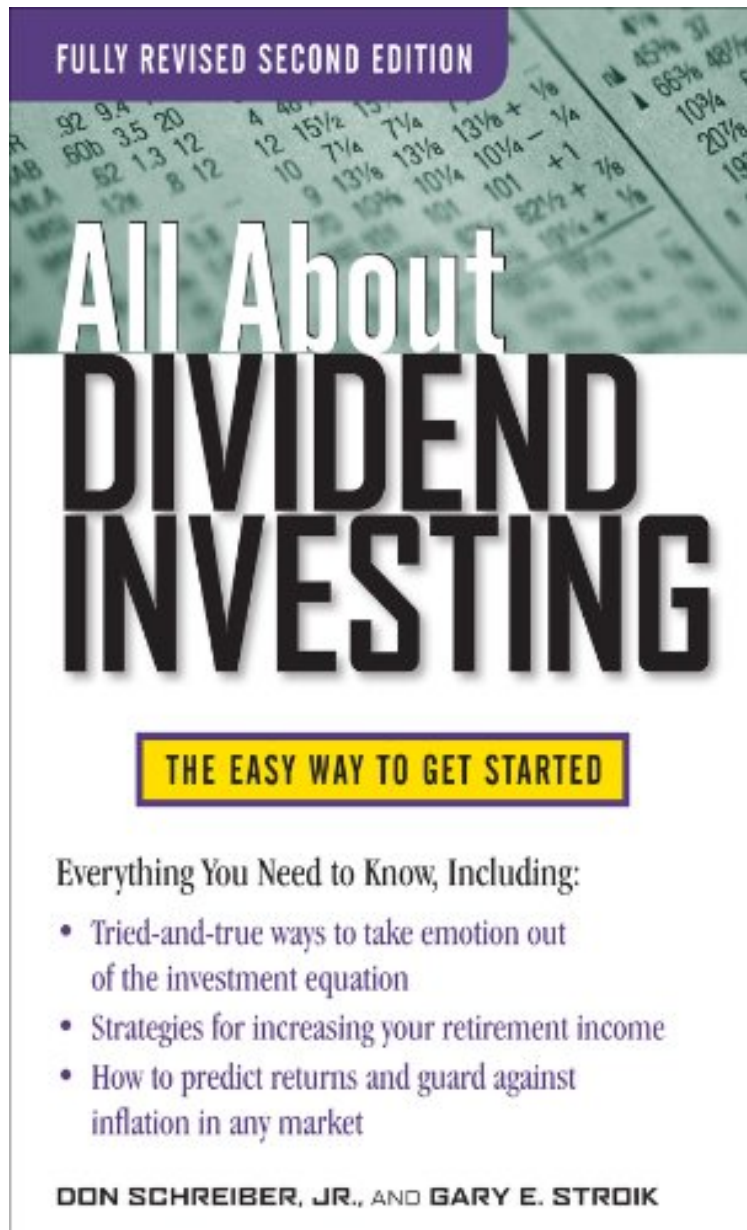

I think that dividends are an important component, but just a component, that leads to the overall growth of a portfolio. Dividend stocks , generally value picks, rise and fall faster and slower than growth stocks, depending on the economic cycle and what types of stocks are trendy at that moment. If you buy value stocks when they're out of favor this strategy will work just fine. But if you buy value stocks when they're hot (like right now, at the beginning of 2017) you might be buying at the peak when growth stocks perform better. I am a fan of dividend stocks, and value stocks. So, I appreciate the message. And if you can buy and hold, or dollar cost average into dividend stocks over several market cycles, you should do fine. As for choosing individual stocks, I am not a fan at all. Low cost index funds or ETFs are the way to go, in my opinion. The explosion of ETFs allows an investor to choose a dividend-focused approach without following individual companies. Indexes do not go bankrupt.3 of 3 people found the following review helpful.
