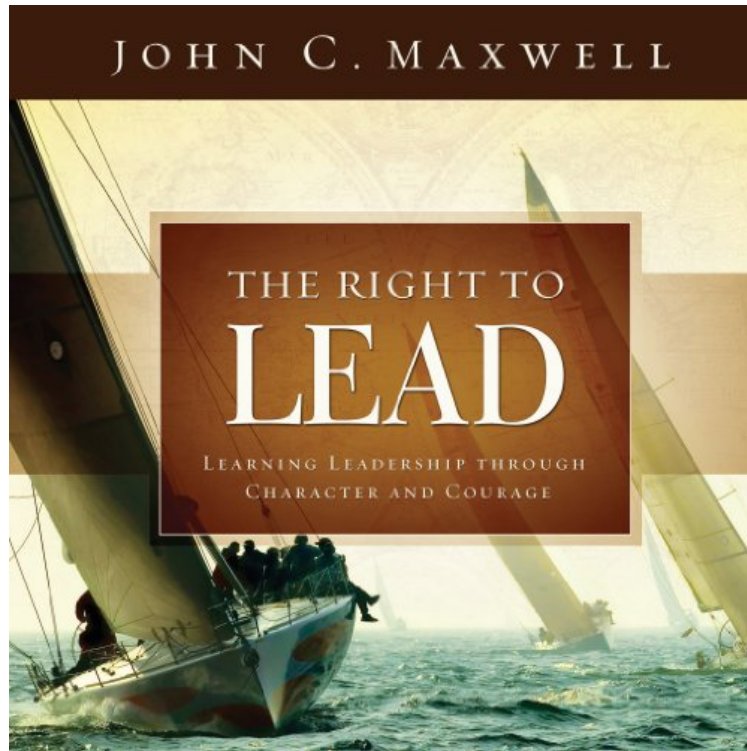

He doesn't just motivate you for an hour or two but forces you to think further and act in order to change your life.
