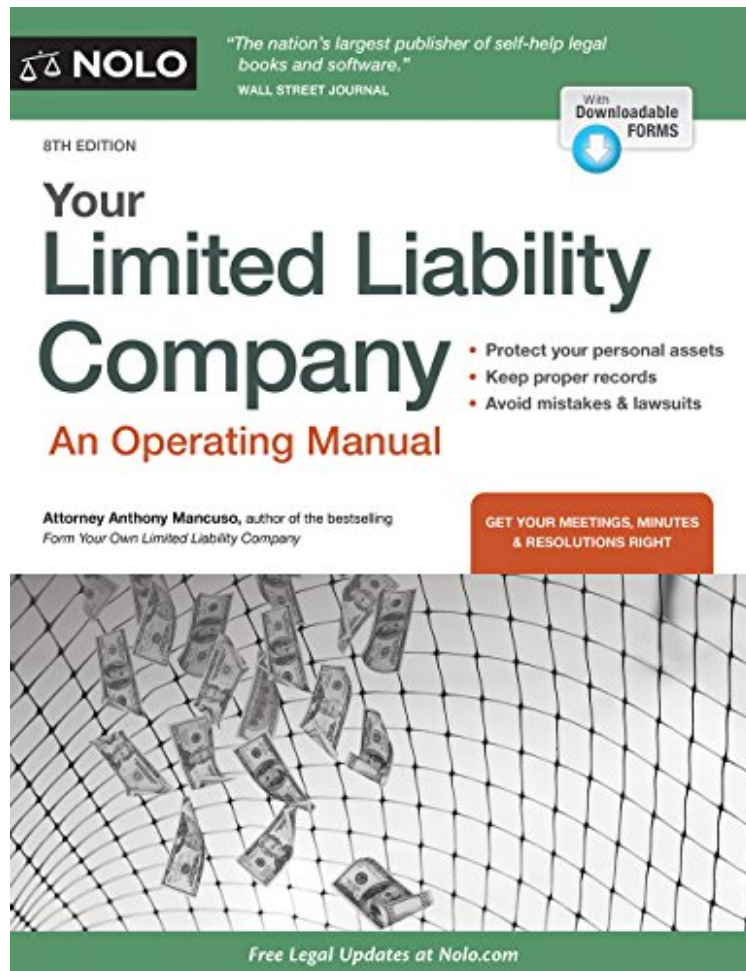

It is not necessary to read the book from cover to cover; he suggests reading chapters 1 and 2, which explain some basics about LLCs and the options you have for making decisions, then, armed with this information, the reader can decide whether to document the particular decision to be faced by (1) holding an actual meeting of your members and/or managers, (2) preparing minutes for a meeting that doesn't actually occur (paper meeting), or (3) obtaining the written consent of your members and/or managers to the action or decision at hand. The members and managers of smaller LLCs that are privately owned and have a manageable number of members (up to about 35) with employees (up to about 50) can work together without a great deal of controversy."
